The phones are ringing constantly with individuals desperately trying to place these animals. Even the fosters have maxed out what they can handle and still there are way too many kittens. The reality is these organizations have a limit as to how many they can house and afford to rescue. *Please* help spay and neuter all felines - personal pets, strays, or feral cats. This really is the only solution to the feline overpopulation problem. Thank you!

The grant will be used to help implement the 2019 Heartland R&R program which includes adoption preparation for rescued cats at the Heartland shelter. Specifically, the grant will help pay for necessary medical treatment and testing, vaccinations, spay/ neuter surgeries and routine animal care.
